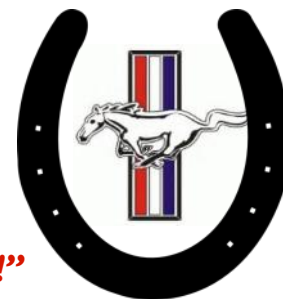

2013 Mustang Boss 302 - Five Years Later

I'm Miguel Rosario. Together with my wife, Jan, we own LS-190, a 2013 Laguna Seca edition of the Ford Mustang Boss 302. You're reading this article because I was invited to write a short piece for the San Antonio Mustang Club Newsletter, *Hoofprints*. So, what can I say?

- Buyer's Regret?
- It's a Lot of Car
- Where Have I Driven it?

Buyer's Regret? No, I have no buyer's regret. While the Boss 302 is no longer the top performing road course-oriented model in the Mustang range, it was so from October 2012 until September 2014. That's a good run for a car at the end of its product cycle (I bought the Boss 302 in July 2012)! Besides, the Boss 302 comes with a winning pedigree: Paul Brown Jr., driver for Tiger Racing, won the 2011 Sports Car Club of America World Challenge championship driving the Boss 302S ("S" for shorter sprint races) in the GTS Class. Paul Brown Jr./Tiger Racing won races at Long Beach, Mosport, Mid-Ohio, and Laguna Seca while other Boss 302S Coupes won races at Saint Petersburg and Infineon race courses. In its racing debut, the Boss 302S won six of twelve races in the 2011 season! There's no regret in buying a race-winning car.



It's a Lot of Car. For you drag racing enthusiasts, the Boss 302 Laguna Seca is not going to impress you; but, it is a road course-oriented car, not a 1/4 mile racer. Zero to 60 mph arrives in 4.2 seconds, and a standing start in the 1/4 mile passes by in 12.7 seconds at 114 mph. Top speed is drag-limited to 161 mph. Given that the engine displacement was deliberately limited to 5 liters (in keeping with the 1969—1970 SCCA Trans Am rules), my Boss 302 Laguna Seca managed to put down 397 rear-wheel horsepower on an engine dynamometer at 7,200 rpm (redline is 7,500 rpm). Ford reports 444 horsepower for the Roadrunner 5.0 liter V-8 engine, not counting driveline loss. The Boss 302 was designed to beat the BMW M3's lap time at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca; and, it did so on its first test run there in 2011. Its best lap time there is 1:39.50. At Virginia International Raceway, the Boss 302 Laguna Seca posted a solid 3:02.8 lap time during *Car and Driver* magazine's 2012 Lightning Lap event.

2013 Mustang Boss 302 - Five Years Later (story by Miguel Rosario continued...)

Where have I Driven it? It's only been on one race track: Circuit of the Americas, Summer 2016. I, along with twenty other Mustang drivers, was permitted to drive a single parade lap at a glacially slow speed of 35 mph (no one was allowed to drive quickly—but, I did manage to get up to 100 mph on the main straightaway—after all, I had to close the gap between me and the car in front of me). I've driven the car twice to Corpus Christi, Texas, and once to Manhattan, Kansas. Otherwise, the car has spent its time driving in and around San Antonio, Texas.

In Closing: I have no intention of selling the Boss 302 Laguna Seca. I've only changed the tires (from Pirelli P-Zero Corsa to Michelin Pilot A/S) and the lug nuts (from chrome-color to blue-color). From time-to-time, I've toyed with the idea of installing four-or-five-point seat belts, a harness bar to attach the racing seat belts to, a high-capacity engine oil cooler, a Watts link for the rear suspension, an extra set of wheels and tires for high per-

formance driving events, high-temp brakes, and high-temp brake fluid. Since parts upgrades are so expensive, the Boss 302 Laguna Seca will remain stock as it is all the car I'll ever need. It's been a good ride so far—and I've enjoyed driving every one of the twenty-five thousand miles clocked on the odometer too!

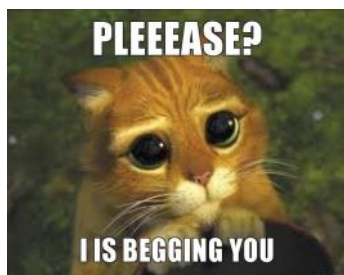


Ready to join SAMC?

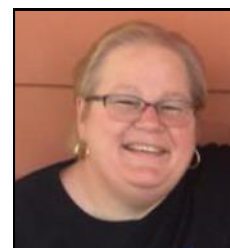

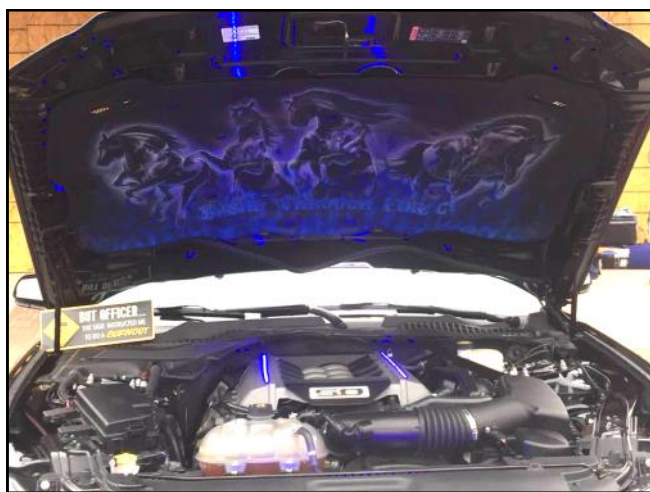
Texas Corvette Association Car Show in Boerne, TX

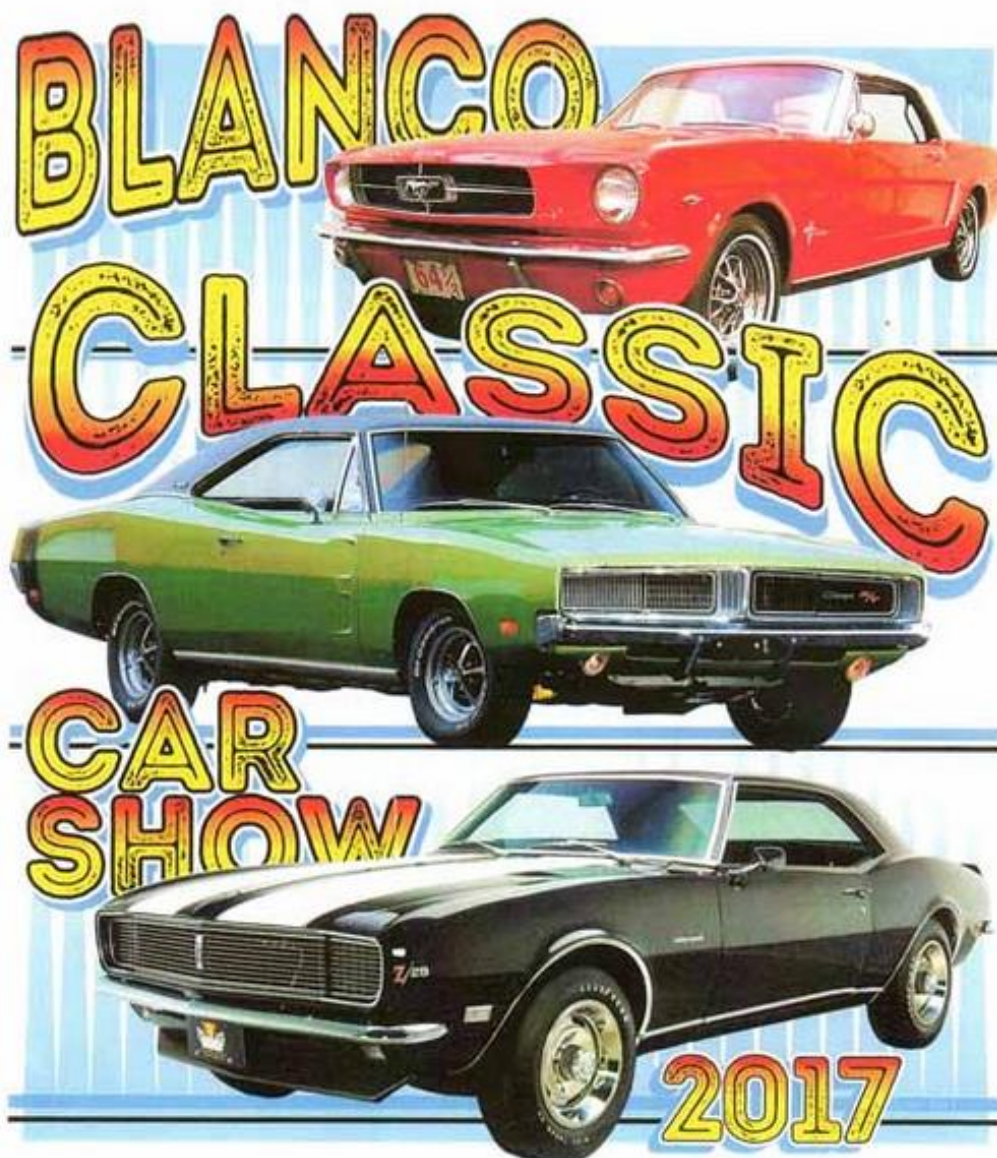

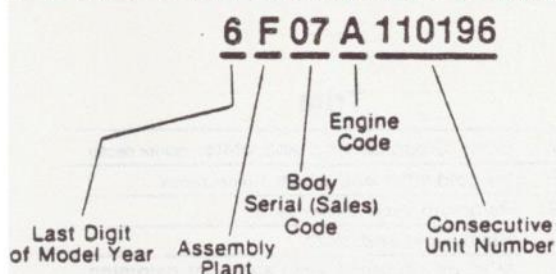
** DECODING YOUR MUSTANG WARRANTY PLATE **

With this issue of Hoofprints we are starting what we hope will be a useful series for those of you who have wondered what all those numbers and letters on your car's warranty plate mean. Being able to understand the plate and, therefore, understand where and when your car was assembled; what engine, transmission, and axle ratio your car is supposed to have; and which exterior paint and interior trim colors you should have is important for the Mustang enthusiast -- especially those of you who want your car to be authentic.

The series will take only 2 years at a time, the first one covering through 1966 (so we fudged on the 2 years). Next issue we will cover 1967-68. The material for this series comes from a new publication by the editors of Mustang Monthly, 1964½-1973 Mustang Data Plate Decoder, priced at \$4.95. Hoofprints would like to acknowledge the editors of Mustang Monthly for their useful material, and we therefore present this information to the membership for instructional purposes. *Jack Klug*

1964½ - 1966 Mustang Warrant Plate Decoding

FORD VIN BREAKDOWN



All 1964½ through 1969 Mustangs received a reverse-stamped Warranty Plate, a metal tag riveted to the rear face of the driver's side door. In 1970 and subsequent years, the metal Warranty Plate was replaced by a plastic Vehicle Certification Label. Both the Warranty Plate and the Vehicle Certification Label contain information about the car's equipment, including body type, exterior color, interior trim, manufacture date (1964½ through 1969), district code, axle, and transmission. The Mustang VIN also appears on the Warranty Plate and the Vehicle Certification Label, but clearly states "Not For Title or Registration".

Unfortunately, due to accidents and resulting door changes, many Mustangs lack their original Warranty Plate or Vehicle Certification Label. Often, a damaged door was replaced with a good door from another Mustang, without switching the coded plates. Therefore, some Mustang Warranty Plates and Vehicle Certification Labels do not match the car's permanent VIN found in the locations described earlier. Also, the 1970

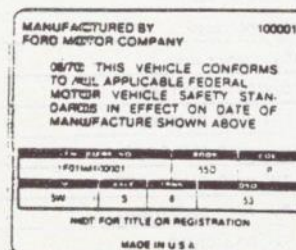
through 1973 laminated plastic Vehicle Certification Labels often become illegible after the passage of time. Regrettably, the codes are not obtainable from Ford Motor Company records.

DSO (District Special Order) codes indicate the sales district in which the car was originally sold. Most Mustangs contain only a 2-digit code, which indicates a standard order. However, special order units contain a 6-digit code; for example, 220136. The first two digits are the regular sales district numbers (22 is Charlotte, North Carolina). The last four digits are the consecutive special order numbers (0136 would indicate that the car was the 136th special order car from the Charlotte sales district).

Date codes are included on all 1964½ through 1969 Warranty Plates. The numbers indicate the day of the month that the car was assembled; the letter indicates the month. The month codes are deciphered in each chapter. In 1970 and later years, the date code was deleted from the Vehicle Certification Label, and was found on the OwnersCard in the glove compartment. However, most OwnersCards have been lost over the years, and with it the car's assembly date. A date does appear in the Vehicle Certification Label, but it is the certification date and not the actual assembly date of the car.

The 1965-67 Shelby Mustangs have a serial number riveted atop the Ford VIN on the driver's side inner fender panel. In 1968, the Shelby number was a combination Ford VIN/Shelby serial number. The Ford VIN appears in the normal windshield position.

The 1965-67 Shelybs did not receive Warranty Plates, although they do have the holes punched for the plates. (Some Shelybs, but not all, have plugs in the holes.) The 1968 Shelby got a regular Warranty Plate affixed to its door, and included "Special Performance Vehicle". In 1969, the special Shelby serial plate no longer appeared on the inner fender and the cars are identified by the same method as other Mustangs. A special plate, however, was pop-riveted just beneath the Warranty Plate which read, "Shelby Automotive".

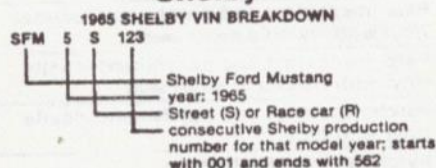

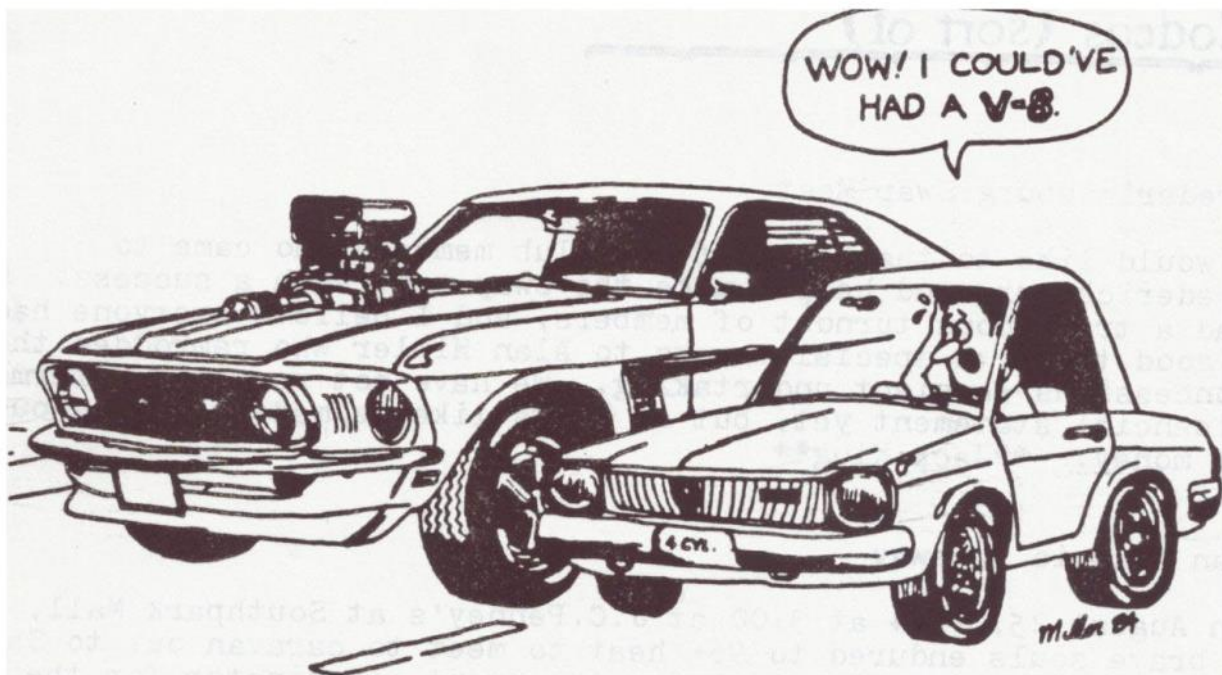

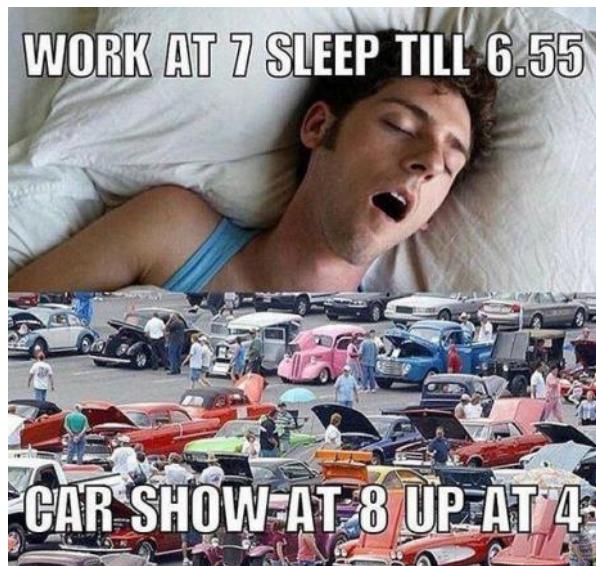

The name "Cobra" came to Carroll Shelby in a dream?

Carroll Shelby was once offered a job at Ferrari but the terms of his employment as a driver were so embarrassing to Carroll that he vowed, "I'm gonna get his A__ someday."

Ford, under the direction of Carroll Shelby is the only American car manufacturer to win the World Manufacturers Championship by winning the Le Mans in 1966, and in so doing, Carroll Shelby obtained Enzo Ferrari's posterior, true to his vow!

The name G.T. 350 was decided upon by Carroll Shelby when one day after weeks of arguing about the name, he turned to Phil Remington and asked him how far it was to the race car shop from where they were in an adjoining hangar. Remington stepped the distance off and reported to Carroll, "about 350 feet." So Shelby, in his typical fashion said, "We'll call it the G.T. 350. If it's a good car, the name won't matter. If it's a bad car, the name won't save it."

The G.T. 350 held the Sports Car Club of America's B production championship in 1965, 1966 and 1967.

Carroll Shelby was once appointed the title "Dog Catcher" in Terlingua, Texas, where he owned land with other partners.

At A Glance: How to Spot Differences in 1964-1/2 - 1968 Mustang



When it comes to the Ford Mustang, this is one pony car that really turns out to be difficult to distinguish from one year to the next in some cases. For starters, it began as a 1964-1/2 model, and from there the changes for each new year, for a while at least, were so subtle that they can't be identified as easily as the GM F-body cars. The [Camaro](#) and [Firebird](#) were a little easier to distinguish between the early years, but the Mustang required a little more research and some help from the pros.

If you look at just the body of the Mustang, spotting the differences between the 1964.5, 1965, and 1966 is going to be a little more difficult because the car essentially didn't change shape at all. But there are some subtle differences, and to get a handle on those changes over the years we reached out to our friends at [Mustangs Unlimited](#), and they helped steer us in the right direction. With help from Ralph Price at Mustangs Unlimited, the differences became a little easier to spot.

Mustangs Unlimited is an online source for just about anything Mustang, with parts and accessories available online, 24 hours a day. There are two warehouses – Manchester, Connecticut, and Lawrenceville, Georgia – that are stocked with your favorite performance parts for 1965-current Mustangs, 1967-'73 Cougar, and 1980-current Ford truck and SUV.

The Mustangs Unlimited website is open all week long, so even when you get that urge to order parts at O'dark-thirty in the morning, you'll be able to place your order. You can also [request a free catalog](#), or view all the parts and accessories online.

1964.5-1966 Model Differences

The 1965 model did have a couple of minor changes from the 1964.5, most of which are difficult to spot for two reasons: First, most of these changes are not exterior cosmetic differences, and they rely on either opening the hood or checking inside the car; second, some of the changes for 1965 weren't immediate, and you can find 1964.5 cues on some early 1965 Mustangs.

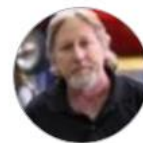


The 1964.5 (left) won't have the hood molding you see on the 1965-'66 models, however, some early 1965 models were missing the molding, making it difficult to distinguish the two. Other than that, there are only very subtle differences between the '64.5 and '65, and might require opening the hood to find out - as long as it's not one of those early '65 models.

1964.5-1966 Model Differences

Though the bodies are the same for 1965 and 1966, the 1965 Mustang has a different grille. The holes in the grille are hexagon shaped (six-sided holes) and the 1966 has slots with chrome horizontal bars. You can also look at the trim on the quarter panel, where the '65 coupe and convertible have a chrome molding, and the '66 coupe and convertible have a vertical molding with three horizontal bars. This is on non-GT models, GTs and Fastbacks you'll have to revert to the grille.

1967-1968 Model Differences

Identifying a 1967-'68 model from the 1964.5-'66 models is a little easier. The first body change for the Mustang, the 1967-'68 body was slightly larger than the early years. The 1964.5-1966 Mustang has a specific body crease line that will be a little bit lower than on the 1967-1968 models.



Top: The '64.5 and '65 grille had hexagonal holes, while the '66 grille had horizontal slots, that's a quick way to tell '65 and '66 apart.
Bottom: The quarter panel trim on non-GT coupe and convertibles will help distinguish the '66 from the earlier models.



The 1967-68 front end will be a bit different from earlier years, which is a dead giveaway. The three scallops on the grille surround for 1964.5-'66, as well as the grille surround itself, are not present on the 1967-'68 models. The headlamp bucket for 1967-'68 extends to the grille.



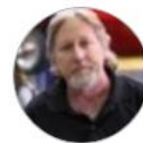
When looking at the quarter panel, the 1967 will have vents, which are missing from the 1968 models.

Top: The 1967-'68 body crease line is higher up, and the headlamp bucket butts up to the grille. The 1964.5-'66 will have a panel between the grille and headlamp bucket with three scallops on it.
Bottom: You can tell 1967 from 1968 by looking at the C-scoop on the quarter panel, the '67 will have vents, whereas the '68 will not.

1967-1968 Model Differences

The tail lamp chrome on the 1967 and 1968 are slightly different. Each of the three lenses will have a chrome surround, but for 1968 there will be a black stripe in that surround.



The 1967 tail lamp chrome (left) does not have the black stripe that the 1968 trim has (right).

The Shelby Mustangs are a little bit easier to differentiate throughout 1965-1968, and are a true stand-out from the other Mustangs. However, there are a lot of clones, so this guide (as the others we've reviewed) is based on factory appearances only.

The 1965 models are only fastbacks, and all are white with blue stripes. The GT350 will get a rocker stripe as well. The 1966 is similar to the 1965 Shelby, but it will have a plexiglass quarter window in place of the vents over the quarter window. The 1967 Shelybs are also in a variety of colors, and included the Hertz GT350H model.



The 1966 Shelby will have a quarter window without the 1965s louvers. Both years have a scoop on the quarter panel.



The 1967-'68 Shelby models had a pair of scoops on the upper and lower quarter panels, and that helps distinguish them at a quick glance from the '65-'66 models. But to distinguish the '67 from the '68 Shelybs, you can check out the lighting, both front and rear.

The front inner lamps on the 1967 are round, and towards the center of the grille, while the 1968 had rectangular fog lamps at the outer edges of the grille. The tail lamps were sequential, and if you look at the 1967 there's a slight point on the outer edge, whereas the 1968 was smooth, without the point.

Shelby Mustangs

The GT500 was new for 1967, with the GT350 spanning all four years. The GT500KR was available in 1968, as well as a convertible Shelby with a roll bar across the front edge of the quarter panels.



Top: The scoops on the sides, both upper and lower, are what differentiates the 1965-'66 from the 1967-'68 Shelby Mustangs.

Bottom: Looking at the front and rear lamps, you can easily identify the 1967 (left two images) from the 1968 (right two images). The round inner lamps make it a 1967, the rectangular make it a 1968, and the tail lamps for the '67 will have that point on the outer edge, whereas the '68 is smooth.

Tech Tip – by Ray Smith

Even though the weather is warm, winter is just over the hill. Now is the time to prepare your Pony for cold weather. Check the anti-freeze. We seldom go below zero, but would recommend at least 10 below to cover the wind chill factor. Also, remember if your anti-freeze is over two years old it should be drained and the system flushed. Check hoses, fan belts, and the old heater so your Pony will be ready for the cold weather. You should check the automatic choke also to prevent your car from stalling. Water in the fuel system can be another problem so you might want to check the fuel filter and lines. Any water can be removed by adding a fuel additive or alcohol (no burbon or gin) – one pint to 15 gallons of gas will not hurt the engine.

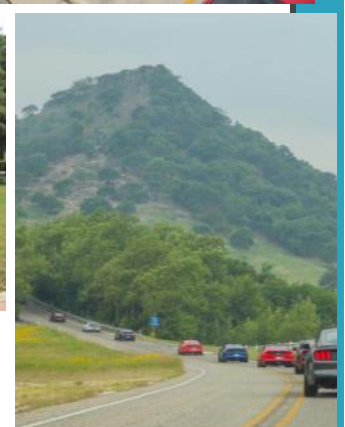
NEISD Career Expo / Show-n-Shine – by Becky Dowda

Hotter Days Are Coming - Be Prepared

Many of you heard Paul Woeppel announce at the last SAMC Membership Meeting that I had been involved in a minor car accident. I'm not sure if you know exactly what happened, so I thought I would incorporate my experience into the Newsletter this month, and combine it with some helpful information about heat exhaustion and dehydration.

Biff Buzby's Burgers is known to be a "hot" spot for car clubs on Friday nights. Since I love to show my black Dashe, and my husband just got his 2007 Mustang, we thought we would go to Biff's and hang out. I arrived there around 5:15pm. The temps were in the mid-90's, so I parked in the shade (mostly), wore shorts, sandals, a T-shirt, and a ball cap. I also took some water with me. While waiting for Mike to arrive, I began to wipe down Dashe to clean her up and get her to shine. I remember sweating a lot, but I was sipping water. Mike called and I talked to him a bit and then hung up the phone.

Next thing I knew, I suddenly felt sick - nauseous, and dizziness started. I sat down and poured water on my head, got in my car and started it up to get the air on me. Things only got worse, and it scared me, so I closed my hood, told a kid that was talking to me that I didn't feel well, and then thought I should drive home to get away from the scene. I thought it would help to calm me down.

As I turned my car to get out of the parking lot, I couldn't find the exit due to the rows being closed off by police (so that folks pay the \$5 fee. So I started to turn the car around again, and I felt like was passing out - and then, I lost consciousness. Next thing I remember is hearing someone calling my name, "Rebecca. Rebecca. Are you okay?" I heard him tell the EMT's that I had been out for about ten minutes. I could hear voices, but I couldn't speak. I couldn't respond right away. I heard them talking about me hitting a fire hydrant. Then, I could move my feet, next I could move my hands and arms. Finally I was able to slowly speak and answer their questions.

I heard Mike's voice tell me he would meet me at the hospital as the EMT's moved me to the ambulance, and then over to the ER across the street. The EMT's were talking about my blood pressure going all over the place, going up and down, and about how I had passed out, called "syncopy." After waiting for a room for 35 minutes, I got seen, given fluids via IV, bloodwork drawn, and EKG done.

After about 8 hours I was released and told that my bloodwork was fine, the EKG was fine, and they felt that I had gotten heat exhaustion due to dehydration. I went home feeling exhausted and embarrassed. I was sad that I had caused harm to my beloved black Dashe. Luckily it wasn't too bad. God was definitely watching out for me and others at Biff's because this could have turned out much, much worse!

So I followed up with my regular doctor who told me something I should have already known... Never, ever get into and drive a car when feeling like you are going to pass out.

He told me to do the following things if you feel like passing out:

- 1) Sit down and put your head between your knees until the feeling passes, or
- 2) lay down on the ground. If you can't do those, then
- 3) sit in your car, put the seat all the way back, and prop your feet up.

Here's what I found on WebMD about heat exhaustion:

- Heat exhaustion occurs when you are exposed to high temps and **often is accompanied by dehydration**.
- The most common signs of heat exhaustion are: confusion, dark urine (sign of dehydration), dizziness, fainting, fatigue, headache, cramping, nausea, vomiting, pale skin, profuse sweating, rapid heartbeat.
- It is essential to get out of the heat immediately, preferably to an air-conditioned room. If you can't do that, then drink fluids (avoiding caffeine and alcohol), apply cold/wet towels to neck, take a sponge bath or cool shower.
- If you don't feel better in 15 minutes, seek emergency help.

Heat exhaustion is related to the heat index. The risk of heat-related illness increases dramatically when the index climbs to 90 degrees or more. So it's important to pay attention to the reported index, and that it is even higher when standing in full sunshine.

People over age 65 or have conditions such as heart, lung, kidney disease, obesity, high blood pressure, or diabetes are at risk for heat exhaustion. Certain medications also are at risk, such as those in the following classes: diuretics, sedatives, tranquilizers, stimulants, heart and blood pressure medications, and medications for psychiatric conditions.

Symptoms of Dehydration include:

Increased thirst, dry mouth, swollen tongue, weakness, dizziness, heart palpitations, confusion, fainting, inability to sweat, decreased urine output, and dark urine color.

Take the person to the hospital ER if these situations occur: Fever over 103F, confusion, sluggishness, lethargy, headache, seizures, difficulty breathing, chest or abdominal pain, fainting, or no urination in 12 hours.

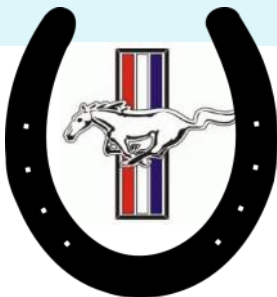
